A Note from Pastor Tom......

Dear Friends,

There is a familiar story of a man who was a worrier. It showed in his face and his posture. He seemed to carry the weight of the world on his shoulders. However, one day this man changed. He had a bounce to his step. It was as if he had not a care in the world. A friend asked what had happened. "Well," he confided, "as you know I have always been one to worry. I have decided that this is both unwise and unhealthy, so I have hired someone to do my worrying for me." "But how much does this cost you?" the friend asked. "Oh, about \$1,000 a week," the man replied. "But how can you afford to pay this man who worries for you?" was the astonished response.

The man answered calmly, "That's his worry!"

I wish it was that easy for some of us to get rid of our worries, don't you?

Jesus once spoke these words:

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?

"And why do you worry about clothes? See how the lilies of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

My guess is that there is someone today who needs to heed these words of our Lord. That one is literally worrying him/herself sick over some situation over which they have no control. That is when one needs desperately to stop for a moment and consider the birds of the air and the lilies of the field and turn the worries over to God.

One way to do that is to determine to live in the present. Continued....

"Therefore do not worry about tomorrow," says Jesus, "for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

That sounds somewhat negative. "Each day has enough trouble of its own." But it is good advice. You and I aren't God. We don't know the future. We may be worrying about something that will never happen. We may be worrying about something that will resolve itself. We need to focus on today.

And that is the heart of the problem, isn't it, our lack of faith? We really don't know how much God loves us. That's why we worry about the future. That's why we hold on to the mistakes of our past. I love the way Isaiah puts it this way in the Old Testament, "*But Zion said, 'The LORD has forsaken me, the Lord has forgotten me.*" Then Isaiah adds these wonderful words, "*Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you!*"

Isaiah is saying that even our own mother might forget us or forsake us, but God never will. Can you even imagine a greater love than a mother for her child? And yet the testimony of scripture is that God's love for each of us is greater than even that.

So this is the message that Jesus has for us this day: Don't worry! Be happy! Live in the present. Always try to do the right thing. God loves you. God will provide for you. I hope this will help you as we continue to endure this pandemic of Covid 19.

Luke 10:25-29 Love God and love neighbor, the greatest commandment

Jesus answers the question, "And who is my neighbor" with the story of the Good Samaritan. Some version of the "Greatest Commandment" or the "Double Love Command" is found in all the synoptic gospels and this version in Luke concludes with the story of the Good Samaritan and is particularly fitting for reflecting on stewardship. This is the basis for Christian life, to love God and love our neighbors. We show our love to our neighbors by giving generously of our time, energy and resources, just as the Samaritan did.

The Elders have decided to resume worship services in our sanctuary on Sunday June 7, 2020.

In an effort to be proactive in keeping our church family safe during the Covid 19 spread, we are making some adaptations as we gather in the church building. The following guidelines will help us protect each other and demonstrate our care for each other:

If you are feeling ill or have a high-risk health condition, we suggest that you stay home for now. We plan to record each service and post it on our church Facebook page:

First Presbyterian Church – Nebraska City

You may wear a mask to worship but it is not required.

You are asked to sit with your family or close friend, and not move around the sanctuary.

Every other row of pews will be closed to allow us to practice social distancing.

Hugs and handshakes are strongly discouraged for the time being.

There will be hand sanitizer available for you to use as you enter the building and sanctuary.

The order of service will be abbreviated. We will not share the peace as we usually do. There will not be a Children's Time. Please place your offerings in the collection plate on the table at the back of the sanctuary either before or after the worship service. We encourage bringing your personal Bible as the Church's Hymnals and Bibles will not be available.

The nursery will NOT be available at this time. Children are to stay with family at all times.

Restrooms are available for use, one occupant at a time. Children must be accompanied by an adult.

When the service is over, please maintain the 6-foot distancing and do not gather in the sanctuary or narthex.
