When was the last time that you gave some thought to the seasons? If there is anything we can count on it is the regularity of the seasons. In a world so full of chaos, the unchanging seasons of life give us hope in our restless world.

The apostle Paul in his letter to Timothy (2 Timothy 4:1-2) says, "Preach the Word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching." Timothy was to be ready in season and out of season, constantly prepared to do whatever God is calling him to do.


What about us today? Like Timothy, we are commanded to always be ready for God's work (<u>1 Peter 3:15</u>; <u>1 Corinthians 16:13</u>; <u>Galatians 6:9–10</u>). This was not an option for Timothy, and it is not an option for us. If you are a Christian, you are a "chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light" (<u>1 Peter</u> <u>2:9</u>). Whether we are speaking to a crowd or changing a tire, we should "be ready in season and out of season" to declare His praises and His truth to a watching world.

I encourage you to think about this as we find summer changing to fall once again.
